CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS

POWA is calling for submissions for its annual Women's Writing Project under the Theme: My Womanhood My World. We are calling for poems, short stories and personal essays that tells the story of a woman's reflection on her life, hope and aspirations for the future. This speaks of women who have experienced shame, grief, fear as well as violence and came out of it even stronger. The theme embodies women who have stepped up and claimed their rightful place in society, women who are now free to speak out on South Africa's Triple Challenge: Unemployment, Poverty and Inequality. The project is a platform for women to share their life's experiences, future hopes, goals, and plans regardless of her lived reality.

Submissions in the following categories will be accepted:

- poetry: no longer than 60 lines
- short story: no longer than 2 500 words
- personal essay: no longer than 2 000 words

GUIDELINES FOR WRITTEN WORK

The POWA Women's Writing Project is only open to women and girl children of all ages living in South Africa.

- Submissions can be written by individual women / girls or by collectives of women and girls.
- Writing can be in any of the country's 11 official languages.
- All writing submitted must be new work, and must not have been published anywhere else.
- All submissions must be accompanied by a short biography of the entrant(s). Biographies should not be longer than 250 words.
- Written work can be submitted via e-mail or post in one of three ways:
 - as **word processed documents** – typed in font size 12, double spaced, printed on white paper;
 - on **CD** containing no files other than the entry; or
 - as **handwritten hard copy documents**, written in large, legible print.
- Deadline for submissions is Wednesday , 31st January 2018
