Research and writing a National Strategic Plan on Gender-Based Violence (NSPGBV) framework to show what we want from government.

Provincial community meetings to make sure YOU are heard.

Media (TV, radio, newspapers) to make noise about the problem of GBV.

Marches in Western Cape, Eastern Cape and Gauteng, demanding an NSPGBV.

Petition signed by South Africans demanding an NSPGBV.

Postcards with personal stories of GBV sent to Minister of Women.
